Decision Making in the Japanese Government: A study of Ringisei by Kioaki Tsuji: "Administrative plans and decisions are made through the circulation of a document called Ringisho, circulated among all officials in the ministry or agency concerned who affix their seals if they agree with the policy proposed. The document gradually works its way up to higher and higher administrators and finally to the minister or top executive. When he approves the Ringisho, the decision is made. This process is called Ringisei".
